LOPEN PARISH COUNCIL

It has been a busy first month for me as Chairwoman. Thank you to those who have made contact with me. I appreciate hearing from you. Here is a brief update of some of the matters we have been working on.

Frogmary anaerobic digester - will the site return to agricultural use?

We received a copy of the application made by the developers of the anaerobic digester (AD) to vary one of the conditions which required the site to be returned to its original condition at the end of the life of the plant. It should be noted that we are not the lead parish for this development. That is South Petherton, who have agreed the variation. However, Lopen PC has objected, since the AD application passed last year was made on the premise that this was an agricultural development, and the passing of the current application would give the developer and also the owner of the site carte blanche to do whatever they should choose - agricultural or not. The parish council has also written to SSDC to seek assurances that the condition that the development was to be a 1MW plant would be enforced, and that the council will not permit the use of non-agricultural waste. For those new to the village, the access to the site runs through our parish as the farm is just the other side of our parish boundary.

Keeping our house in order

Even though we are a small PC with limited assets, we still have to comply with local government legislation. Most recently that includes having in place a risk register, and the proposal for this was agreed at our June meeting. Our Standing Orders and financial regulations (the rules by which we manage the council's business) are in line with nationally agreed standards and are reviewed regularly. All our data and information is regularly posted to the Lopen village website, and we already comply with all key statutory disclosure rules.

Volunteers sought to monitor overweight vehicles

We are seeking volunteers to try and capture data on lorries breaching the weight limit through the village. Please make contact if you have a camera and a spare hour (or even half an hour!). Meanwhile we have written to the developer in Merriott whose delivery lorries are travelling through the village asking him to ensure that this ceases.

Join us? Parish Councillors and Parish Clerk needed

We are looking to co-opt two additional Members to the council and we also need to recruit a new Clerk.

We have had expressions of interest for all posts, which is great, but we would like to extend the invitation to as many of you as possible, so please call us soon. Phone numbers and e-mail addresses are on the back of the Eye.

The War Memorial could form part of the WWI Centenary plans

Historic England have written to us with plans to consider listing the Lopen memorial as part of their response to the centenary of the First World War. Stephen Crane who sits on both the Council and the Parochial Church Council seemed the right person to take this forward and he has agreed. We will let you know the outcome.

LITTERBLITZ!

A big Thank You to the Lopen residents who took part in the local campaign on June 14th to clear litter from the streets of Crewkerne and the surrounding villages. Most of Lopen was covered by our small team of village volunteers and only at Snapant, where workmen have been busy for some weeks, was a significant amount of litter found.



There is no room for complacency, however, as rubbish is often dropped or thrown from vehicles along the main road. Although the vast majority of dog owners pick up after their pets, unfortunately there are still a very few who don't. Apart from the obvious hazards to other walkers, there is a particular problem on footpaths through fields where livestock are at risk of picking up serious infections. The Parish Council has alerted the District Council's Dog Warden to this problem and it will be monitored.

Incidentally, the Village Ranger Scheme which replaced our Lengthsman, has litter collection as a routine part of the contract.
