LOPEN PARISH COUNCIL

Following our September Parish Council (PC) meeting on Tuesday 18th, I am pleased to be able to tell you that our Speed Indication Device (SID) has arrived - somewhat early and unannounced! It was decided that, in order to conform to Highways rules and to satisfy the insurance requirements, we would get the Ranger from Brympton to install the SID as he is the only person, in this locality, who is trained and certified to carry out this work. There now follows a hunt in the village and surrounding area to seek out anyone who is suitably trained and certified, and who would be prepared to move the SID as and when the PC requires. Failing that, the PC will be looking for anyone who would be willing to be trained to undertake this task as a nominal employee of Lopen Parish Council. Please get in touch with a member of the PC if this is 'up your street' - so to speak!! Also, Simon Frackiewicz has asked me to say that following the recent Village Survey, the PC has begun to look at ways to address some of the themes that were highlighted by the respondents. These include the lack of useful public transport links, in particular to hospital appointments, access to shops and getting a greater sense of 'togetherness' in the village. Some of these ideas will be discussed at the next Parish Council meeting.

ADOPT A FOOTPATH

Many thanks to all those who helped with footpath maintenance on the recent 'Care For Your Village' day and again we would also like to extend our thanks to the many within the village who regularly work to maintain the footpaths in their own time. With this in mind we would like to develop an 'adopt a footpath' scheme within the Parish. If you have a

footpath near you and you feel you could spare some time to maintain this with some simple cutting and pruning please let me know. There is no obligation to commit on a regular basis (as we have the village ranger and we will continue to run footpath afternoons) but any help, however small will keep the village looking its best for everyone to enjoy. 
DO YOU WANT TO KNOW MORE ABOUT FORTHCOMING LPC MEETINGS?

nothing. The figures below relate to August for the South Petherton/The Hamdons beat area:

- 147 calls to the police from members of the public in the beat area
- 27 reports of crime, including:
 - 2 Assault
 - 0 dwelling burglary (+ 1 attempt)
 - 2 non dwelling burglary (+ 1 attempt)
 - 3 criminal damage property
 - 1 theft from motor vehicles
 - 1 theft from shops
- Anti Social Behaviour (ASB) 8 reports across the beat.

The Crown Prosecution Service (CPS) have launched a public consultation on the revised public policy guidance on **Crimes Against Older People**. The policy guidance has been developed in partnership with two National Scrutiny Panels, which consist of members with experience and expertise from a community and academic perspective. In advance of its finalisation, we would welcome views on five specific questions regarding the policy guidance. Any other comments outside these questions are also welcome.

COULD YOU HELP RESTORE SOMERSET'S ICONIC FINGERPOSTS?

More volunteers and community groups are being urged to get involved with the project to restore historic signposts in Somerset. In response to stretched finances, the Somerset Fingerpost Restoration Project



was set up by Somerset County Council and the Southwest Heritage Trust in 2016 to help preserve and protect the signs. SCC and the SH Trust have produced a handbook that provides all the information required to

enable community groups to decide if they would like to take part in this valuable project. It also contains a fascinating potted history of fingerposts in Somerset. RAINFALL UPDATE

Jeremy Rook has kindly supplied the following data -I recorded 37mm of rain in August which is 57% of the Long Term Average (LTA).

I was surprised to receive the Environment Agency's August rainfall report showing that the rainfall for the Parrett catchment was 96% of the LTA and for the whole of the Wessex area was 103% - we must have missed out on a lot of showers. Our dry soil shows that my rainfall figures are not a mistake.

We have received 74mm of rain in the 3 months June, July and August which is low, but I see I recorded less in the same 3 months in 1995 (62mm) and only 61mm in the 3 months March to May 1990 (both these latter figures were recorded at Haselbury Plucknett not Lopen).

The Environment Agency report goes on to state: *Reservoir Storage*

Reservoir stocks decreased across all of the main reservoirs in Wessex in August, though they remain significantly above the levels observed in the summers of 1976 and 1995. The month ended with 58% storage across Wessex Water reservoirs.
