FALCONRY DISPLAY

The display on March 14th was attended by 50 people, including three children. Just Women would like to thank all those who attended and made this a successful evening, with a small profit that allowed a donation of £16 to the Church.





In the past two months we have organised 12 road side sessions monitoring 3348 vehicles passing through the village. Of these, 115 drivers were exceeding the current

30mph speed limit and will receive advisory letters from Avon and Somerset Police. The actual figures break down as follows:

LOPEN PARISH COUNCIL ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

This took place on Saturday 11th and was a very civilised affair. Those who came along were able to sample some excellent cake and talk about local concerns. It was however, a little disappointing not to see more new faces, as most who came along already have some sort of contact with the council. More input from a wider crosssection of the village would have been welcome.

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

We still await real progress on the controversial Small Improvements Scheme. Apparently the County Highways design team are still working on it. I am assured that there will be real news very soon. SPEED WATCH

The Speed Watch initiative by SLOW continues to go well. There have now been twelve sessions, mostly at the southern end of the village due to roadworks, and at the last count something like 115 warning letters have been sent to speeding drivers. If you'd like to be involved, more volunteers are still needed and more training sessions are coming up, so please contact Ben Goldsmith or Roger Gurner for more information.

FOOTPATHS

As spring gathers pace the weeds are already pushing through, with the nettles and goose-grass seeming particularly keen this year. To try and keep the paths open for all, there is a Parish Council initiative led by Councillor Ed Moore to hold a "Footpaths Maintenance Party" on Sunday 21st May. FROGMARY GREEN FARM DIGESTER

The Frogmary Green Farm Anaerobic Digester was granted planning permission at the Area North Committee meeting on Wednesday 22nd February. Concerns remain that the conditions imposed will not be sufficient to control traffic levels to and from the site despite the best efforts of the Parish Council.

BROADBAND

Although we now have a new, fibre connected cabinet installed in the village, it remains remarkably difficult to discover who is going to benefit from it and how soon. Lopen is currently fed by two cabinets. One is already fibre enabled, but located in South Petherton and thus too far away to give decent speeds and the original one in the village is not fibre enabled. It is hoped that eventually the whole village will be connected to the new one and benefit from much higher connection speeds. However, connecting the existing local copper network to the cabinet is a fairly big job and no timescales have been given. To further confuse matters, Gigaclear, who have been awarded the phase 2 contract for connecting Devon and Somerset, also appear to be expecting to do some work in the village, although they are not saying when either!

PLANNING MATTERS

We have seen a flurry of planning applications recently which make it necessary to call an additional Parish Council meeting in April. If you want to find out about planning applications in the area, the SSDC website is really useful for viewing both the plans and the comments. It also allows you to sign up to a weekly email listing new applications in your chosen area. You can also comment directly on line if you wish.

SHORTAGE OF COUNCILLORS

We remain short of councillors, with three vacancies. This is a concern. We are at the point where the council cannot function properly if one councillor cannot attend a meeting and another has to declare an interest. We've now been advertising vacancies for 6 months without interest and I'm beginning to wonder not only whether Lopen is large enough to support a council of seven members, but even if we should consider looking at forming an alliance with one of our neighbouring parishes. This would very much be a last resort as I believe Lopen should remain independent, so I hope someone will come forward and remove it from my thoughts!

DOG BIN

The new dog poo bin has now been installed at the corner of Water Street and Kitchens Lane and is being used. Thanks are due to Councillor Adam Dance and Olivia Busby of SSDC for finding the funding and getting it installed promptly.

COUNTRYSIDE CODE FOR THE PUBLIC

Spring is a lovely time of year when we 'break out' from the winter and enjoy the countryside daffodils, lambs, and the lovely fresh air. So, just a reminder to think of the farmers too when out walking, remember:

- Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths.

- A farmer will normally close gates to keep farm animals in, but may sometimes leave them open so the animals can reach food and water.

- Leave gates as you find them or follow instructions on signs. When in a group, make sure the last person knows how to leave the gates.

- Follow paths unless wider access is available, such as on open country or registered common land (known as 'Open Access' land).
