# **NEWS from SLOW** The shocking reality of speeding through our village

# Peter Little CBE 1943 - 2018



Peter, who lived in Frog Street, died sudenly at the end of January from complications following a medical procedure. Peter played an active role in village life since moving here with Penny in 2005, including as chairman of Lopen Parish Council 2007 - 2011 when he fought valiantly for Lopen's interests. Peter enjoyed a distinguished and varied career in public service both in the UK and overseas.

# SLOW is the village campaign to stop speeding through Lopen



Over six days at the end of January this year 8,239 vehicles passed through Lopen of which some 4 out of 10 were driven at or below the 30mph speed limit. That leaves the remaining 6 out of 10 being driven illegally at speeds in excess of the speed limit. Over half of these were recorded at speeds between 40-50mph. No fewer than 53 drivers were logged at over 60mph and three individuals, believe it or not, at more than 70mph. This detail was recorded on a Speed Indicator Device (SID) which, on temporary loan, was positioned on the grass verge on the Holloway - Merriott Road by a member of Lopen's SLoW campaign. SLoW's aim, with Lopen Parish Council, is to purchase SIDs, hopefully one for either end of the village, possibly sharing the cost with Merriott PC. It is anticipated that the police will follow up speeding drivers from information captured on the SIDs.

#### **Peter Little**

Peter was a former councillor and chairman of the Parish Council and contributed many hours of his time to village matters. He continued to take a keen interest after leaving the Council and I used to welcome his occasional emails offering support, background information and insightful observations. I shall miss these very much and I shall also miss our occasional meetings around the village too.

#### **New Councillors**

The Council still has one position vacant so there is the opportunity to join if you wish to put yourself forward.

#### **Road Safety Improvements**

Many of you will have noticed the 'demonstration' speed indicator device (SID) loaned to the village by Traffic Technology for a week. With its larger, brighter display it certainly seemed to be having the desired effect on passing traffic though the speed statistics (displayed on the village noticeboard) make alarming reading. We hope to have a second week sometime soon. Thanks are due to Roger Gurner for organising the trial and doing the hard work! Meanwhile, we have been negotiating with Somerset County Council over the training required for anyone working with a SID. The official requirements are quite onerous and seemed to present a significant obstacle. However, there do now seem to be ;possibilities of a couple of ways around this, though discussion continues.

#### **Annual Parish Meeting**

The statutory annual village meeting will be held entirely separately from any Parish Council meeting as it was last year. The current plan is to have a PC presence at the Plant Fair on Saturday 12th May, possibly followed by a short meeting in the evening.It is an opportunity to come along and talk to your councillors on a completely informal basis. Find out who we are, what we do, tell us what your local concerns are and what you think we should be doing.

#### **Library Consultation**

Once again our local libraries are under threat as Somerset County Council look for ways to save money. With SCC funding from central government being cut from £90 million in 2013/14, to just £26 million for 2017/ 18 and falling to zero by 2020/21, it is not surprising there is a shortage of money! The future looks bleak for South Petherton which will be reduced to a mobile service only. Unless, that is, premises can be found or funded 'locally' - that is by the parish council. #### Police & Communities Together (PACT) Meeting

We recently had the honour of an invitation to the first PACT meeting - held at the Edgar Hall in Somerton. This was quite interesting, though perhaps not for the right reasons. The first point of note was to find out just how thin the blue line of community policing has become. A staff of just 8 covers 53 towns and villages, 31 parishes, 48 pubs and 7 community speed watch areas. The warranted officers among them are also expected to attend emergency calls and this causes many pre-arranged meetings to be missed. The second point of note was how prevalent traffic issues have become across this area with nearly everyone wanting to talk about speeding, HGV traffic, parking problems and driving standards. The police were guick to point out that they simply do not have the resources to deal with all these issues on their own. They observed that many could be alleviated by changing road lay-outs, which falls under the remit of County Highways, and will attempt to get a representative to attend the next meeting!
