SUPER FAST BROADBAND - LATEST

There have been three separate sessions of roadworks during late January and February, all on behalf of BT/Openreach. It seems that they are attempting to provide a clear route to draw cables through eventually, but are carrying out the work a section at a time.

Update from 'the man down the hole in the road' (on February 20th) - he has stated (with complete confidence) that the fibre connection to the new

cabinet will be completed TODAY and that, subject to routine testing and final enabling at the exchange, he believes that the system will be live in about a week (February 27th?). That means fibre to the new cabinet and then the existing copper service throughout the village. His unnofficial view is that, once enabled, anyone within 200 metres of the cabinet is likely to get speeds of up to 15mbs, with the usual degrading as the distance increases! Watch this space for more updates!

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

I had hoped to be able to report real progress on the controversial Small Improvements Scheme. However, at the time of writing there is little new to report. Apparently the level of response from the village has led to a complete "back to the drawing board" approach which is being overseen at the highest level. I am assured that there will be real news very soon.

SPEED WATCH

I'm pleased to report that the Speed Watch initiative by SLOW continues to go well. If you'd like to be involved, more volunteers are still needed and more training sessions are coming up, so please contact Ben Goldsmith or Roger Gurner for more information.

FOOTPATHS

Our footpaths are technically the responsibility of the County Council and their footpaths team has worked hard recently to deal with damaged or missing path furniture. In particular, there have recently been major safety improvements made to the footpath between Kitchens Lane and Holloway where it meets Holloway. However, when it comes to keeping the paths clear of plant growth, County simply does not have the

resources, so it's something that will have to tackled at a local level.

With this in mind, there is an initiative led by Councillor Ed Moore to hold a "footpaths action day" in late May or early June. There is still some discussion about what form this might take, but suggestions include:

- Groups of people with strong footwear trampling the undergrowth down, perhaps encouraged out by a treasure hunt, routes featuring points of natural or historical interest, or even the promise of a barbecue afterwards.
- Suitably armed working parties to tackle particularly bad areas.

Additional ideas and volunteers are welcome!

FROGMARY GREEN FARM DIGESTER

The Frogmary Green Farm Anaerobic Digester was granted planning permission at the Area North Committee meeting on Wednesday 22nd February. Concerns remain that the conditions imposed will not be sufficient to control traffic levels to and from the site despite the best efforts of the Parish Council.

BROADBAND

As most will be aware (especially the long suffering residents of upper Holloway), BT contractors have been busy installing cable ducts and fibre optic cables to connect the new broadband cabinet. There is still no official information on when service will improve, but information gathered from various unofficial sources suggest it should be sooner rather than later.

SEASONAL CRIME REDUCTION



Many householders are now starting to think about spring cleaning. In addition to cleaning, painting and decorating, have a look at your home security. Is that door lock a bit worn? Where are the keys to that window lock? Fit that new hasp and padlock to the shed you have been meaning to

do. Have a look at your boundaries' fencing and hedges. Repair and secure fencing damaged by the winter weather. Did your hedges get a bit overgrown last year, reducing surveillance around your property? Well now is the time to prune them back – before the wild birds start building their nests. As part of your spring clean, have the house alarm checked and serviced.

CYBER CRIME is something that is of concern to many. In general terms, advice includes ensuring that your computer has a firewall and encrypted server, passwords are never written down, only purchase items from reputable sites, don't respond to emails from people you don't know and never send personal information, including bank details. Remember if it sounds too good to be true, it probably is

Update regarding SLOW and the Speed Watch Teams. In the first instance, it's fair to say that neither we nor the Parish Council have been able to get a straight forward answer from Highways,

despite repeated and regular prompts from both Nick Jones and ourselves. The situation seems to be that a review and changes are being considered against the original scheme, but no one is prepared to say what and when we might know. The only thing certain, at least we hope that is the case, is that a second proposal will be made to the village at some stage, but our concern now is whether the funding will still be in place. Regarding the **Speed Watch** campaign - we have had a good response from those members who have received training, but the weather and the road works have served us really badly in that we have only been able

to stage 5 out of the 12 sessions planned. With the result that the statistics are not yet really truly representative of the normal traffic flow. Nevertheless, we have been able to report about



a dozen speeders, including one school bus at **38 MPH!**, but the very presence of people in Hi Vis jackets is enough to visibly slow the traffic down.

VILLAGE SUPPER

A splendid evening was enjoyed by a full house - shepherds pie and desserts were followed by a quiz and beetle drive. Many thanks to all those who prepared the room, wrote the quiz, supplied the food and cleared up afterwards!

BOTTLE TOPS

As you know, Martin & Sally-Ann collect milk bottle tops for the Dorset & Somerset Air Ambulance - these are added to a wider collection in the area. A recent 'weigh-in' was conducted and a total of 686 kilos was recorded (around 440,000 tops) which achieved a sum of £82.32 for the Air Ambulance (£30 more than last year). A big thank you to Lopen residents who have donated the tops!


