COUNCILLOR VACANCY

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

Although it has long been known as one of Lopen's biggest issues, at the last council meeting it became evident just how strongly many villagers feel about the main road situation. A large group of residents representing the recently formed "Lopen Road Safety Action Group" (LRSAG) attended the meeting to make their feelings known. This representation followed a 25-strong inaugural meeting the previous weekend and is a very positive development.

The safety measures suggested included:

- 20mph speed limit right through the village
- Flashing speed indication signs at both ends of the village
- White lines and "soft kerbs" at the sides to make the carriageway appear narrower.
- Larger, clearer signage.

A clear message was also delivered that measures in the village centre should take priority over changes to Snapant, as favoured by the County Council.

The other important development is the strong intention by LRSAG to re-start a Speed Watch scheme, something that the Council is very happy to support. As well as its basic deterrent effect, this is also an important way of collecting data on traffic speeds, volumes and numbers of HGVs, to help gain further support from the police and County Council. The aims of LRSAG are very much in line with the aims of the Parish Council and we look forward to working together.

As has been written before, there is an improvements scheme already in the design stage with many of the suggestions made already in the design brief. We are still awaiting the design proposal from the County Highways team and hope to meet with them in the near future.

REPORT A PROBLEM ON THE ROADS

A new online, interactive map has been launched by Somerset County Council to allow residents to report potholes and other issues on Somerset's Highways. This allows road users to report any issues across all 4,206 miles of Somerset's highways. Residents can

now go on the website to report issues they find on a highway such as a pothole, blocked drain or poor road surface. Simply log the issue on the map by location and then fill in the details of the problem using an online form. People can also leave an email address to receive updates on potholes they have reported. The County Council state that "reported road defects will be inspected within 3 working days, and programme repair work will be scheduled where required".

DOG POO BIN

The recent PC meeting saw further discussion on the dog poo bin subject. It was agreed that Lopen needs at least one poo bin and Councillor Dance has offered to try and get one for us. This then leads to the question of where it might be best located. It needs to be somewhere on regular dog-walking routes, by a road where it can be easily accessed for emptying and where there is space for it. Locations suggested so far include:

- -Rydon Lane,
- -Corner of Water Street and Kitchen Lane, adjacent to the footpath entrance
- -Further up Kitchen Lane where the footpath goes off to the west.
- -Top of School Lane, where the footpaths branch. The final location will have to be approved by SSDC mainly to ensure they can access it.

SEASONAL CRIME REDUCTION



With the evenings starting to draw in, it is perhaps time to check your house security. Leaving lights on timers can give 'illusion of occupancy' - you can even buy a timer device that makes it look as if you are at home watching the TV. This is particularly useful when you are going out during

the evening taking, part in hobbies, going to the theatre, watching Carnivals across the county, going on holiday etc. For those in a rural community you may also be topping up your oil tanks in readiness for the winter. Criminals take advantage of this and we often see a rise in heating oil thefts during the autumn. Consider adding an approved padlock to the tank or perhaps a tank alarm which can be linked to your domestic system or can even send a message to your smartphone.

It is important to remember that all crime and suspicious activity should be reported to the police. Numbers to use are:

999 Including emergencies which are life-threatening, in fear of safety, crime in progress, bogus callers.

101 To report incidents that require non urgent police attention including reporting of crime, suspicious activity, intelligence.

0800-555111 To report suspicious activity and intelligence matters anonymously.
