




Lopen Village Spring Plant Sale

NEW COUNCIL YEAR BEGINS

It's that time of the year again. With May once again, it's time for the AGM (24th May) and election of a chairman for the coming year. It also marks 3/4 of the way through this electoral period, with elections due this time next year, though an actual election would only be needed should more than seven people put themselves forward.

ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

The statutory annual village meeting will be held entirely separately from any Parish Council meeting, as it was last year. The intention is to have a PC presence at the plant fair on Saturday 12th May, followed by a short meeting in the evening. This will include a brief review of the year's bigger issues but it is mainly an opportunity for you to come along and talk to the councillors on an informal basis. Find out who we are, what we do, tell us what your local concerns are, tell us what you think we should be doing. This year, more than ever, we'd really like to see you as we are going to be updating the parish plan and need your input. We would also like to get your views on the purchase of a speed indicating device and ideas about how to help with its funding.

as I've said several times before in this column, in order for the Parish Council to represent your views, we need to know what they are!

2017/18 ROUND-UP

Looking back over the last year of Council business, as it was the year before, the main road through the village has been the subject most at the fore. The County Council "Small Improvements Scheme" continued to be extremely contentious and while we were eventually able to reach a compromise, we still await confirmation of when it will actually be carried out. Following on from this the possibility of getting our own village Speed Indication Device (SID) has emerged. This is not entirely straight-forward but seems well worth pursuing. Planning, especially anything to do with our two industrial areas, also takes a lot of time and the latest application by Probiotics, for a very large warehouse building at Lopen Head, has been no exception. At time of writing it appears to be on hold following objections from County Highways about HGV access and parking, so the story is not over yet.

PARISH BIER

The recent sale of Elizabeth Fenwick-Moore's property made it necessary to clear the house and barn. This has meant the re-discovery of the village bier, which has been resting in there for many years having been displaced from the Bier house by chairs, tables and the lawnmower. It is quite a substantial thing, nicely made and, while in need of some TLC, basically sound.

Apparently, it dates from around 1932 making it a significant piece of village history that ought to remain in the village. Right now though, it lacks a purpose and a permanent home. Ideas welcome!

COUNTRYSIDE CODE FOR THE PUBLIC

Spring is a lovely time of year when we 'break out' from the winter and enjoy the countryside - daffodils, lambs, and the lovely fresh air.

So, just a reminder to think of the farmers too when out walking, remember:

- Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths.
- A farmer will normally close gates to keep farm animals in, but may sometimes leave them open so the animals can reach food and water.
- Leave gates as you find them or follow instructions on signs. When in a group, make sure the last person knows how to leave the gates.
- Follow paths unless wider access is available, such as on open country or registered common land (known as 'Open Access' land).
