
Monday 8th May - Coronation Big Lunch - neighbours and communities invited to share food and fun together across the country.

Always look on the bright side...

Seasonal update from Philip Harper from the Churchyard Eco-Group:

Bird Boxes -

'the beginning of February found Ben, Nick and myself checking the bird boxes for signs of activity and clean out the old nests, only to find all four tit boxes had been used for nesting. However there had been little use of the two open-fronted Robin boxes. The tit boxes needed a little maintenance to ensure they will be waterproof for the coming season and some screws needed replacing.

Planting -

Our next activity was the snowdrop and primrose planting session on the 25th of February.

Bird-watch -

Whilst checking the bird boxes we spotted Britains smallest bird - the Goldcrest. An individual bird is said to weigh little more than a five pence piece. Its call has been likened to 'rubbing a damp finger down a pane of glass', but its song has been called 'a wonderful silver-toned tinkle'. Apparently it is useful as a standard test to ones hearing, as it is said to be the first song old-age loses.

Free Compost -

We also opened the left-hand compost bay in the Churchyard for anyone to help themselves for their own gardens.

April watch -

Finally, something to listen out for in April is the cuckoo. Twenty-five years ago they were very common in the village, but have gradually become less so. I only heard one on one day last year, but traditionally mid-April is the time sightings start.

And by the time you read this the bats will have emerged and should be a common site again.

Rainfall report 13 March 2023 - Jeremy Rook

After a wet January, February was very dry. I recorded only 4.2 mm of rain during that month and it was the driest February that I have recorded. My second driest February was 1993 with 8 mm of rain. The Long -Term Average for February is 67 mm.

The first half of January had rain practically every day and it felt as though we were going to have a repeat of January and February 2104, when large low-lying areas of Somerset experienced flooding. Fortunately the rain stopped and we had a dry February.

Now in March we have a week where we have had rain every day so there is reduced danger of a Spring drought. Reservoir levels are now full in the Wessex Water area.

Charity Update:

REFUGEE AID FROM TAUNTON 2023



In March much of Britain was covered in snow and temperatures are very low everywhere. But small signs of spring were also everywhere and summer will eventually follow. As it is for us, so for Southern Europe and for the Middle East where night temperatures can be freezing. In preparation, Raft is requesting, from those who are able to give, lightweight clean washable clothing for men (not extra large, please), women, children and babies and suitable footwear for all; unopened hygiene products for all are very necessary. Raft has also been specifically asked for crutches, folding wheelchairs and new off-the-shelf medication. When I recently visited Raft's warehouse a huge number of boxes of medical supplies, mainly funded by trustees selling new items online, but some by supporter fundraising, were waiting to be collected and transported overseas.


