

Rainfall report 3rd May 2023:

March was a very wet month – to quote the Environment Agency "March 2023 is the third wettest March since records began in 1891, Wessex hasn't received this volume of rainfall in March since 1947." Rainfall occurred daily from the sixth of March every day to the end of the month.

April was on the damp side of average, with temperatures below average for the time of year. As gardeners know, plants have been slow to get going this Spring.

Calendar year to date we have had above average rain despite the dry February.

The hosepipe bans in Cornwall and West Devon seem a mystery given that those areas have had at least average rain in the last 12 months – I expect their reservoirs do not hold enough water and rely on Summer rain to top them up (which of course was deficient last year). Wimbleball reservoir is now full so there is no hosepipe ban for East Devon/ West Somerset.



Sunday School Room Renovation & Fundraising Update

We are so grateful to all those who have contributed to our fundraising campaign for the Sunday School Rooms (SSR). So far we have already raised over £18,500 towards our target of £60,000, which is made up of personal donations, gift aid (to be claimed), fundraising events, (The West Side Story Singalong raised over £750 for example), PCC reserves and a grant of £6,000 from the Garfield Weston Foundation. Many thanks to all of you for your support!

BUT more is needed - please help in any way you can.

In addition to this, our hard working treasurer, Steve Chapman, has been applying for further grants, which we hope to hear back from soon. This fundraising really is vital to this important community building. The thatch is in urgent need of repair and is unlikely to survive another Winter. While temporary repairs have been carried out to the floor so that the building can continue to be used, a new floor is desperately needed.





A question has been raised over the ownership of the SSR and we are very grateful to the Rev. Preb. Stephen Lowe who has undertaken considerable research on this, including going through the Minute Book: School Board Parish of Lopen.

He has summarised his findings by stating "the building is a charitable trust of the Vicar and Churchwardens for the benefit of the Lopen Villagers and Church members, with legal ownership vested in the Diocese of Bath and Wells, and with the financial responsibility held by the PCC". Lopen History Casebook

CHAPTER 1 - The Lopen Roman Mosaic

With the Roman equivalent of the M5 - The Fosse Way - running through what we call Lopenhead and Broomhill/Snapant, its safe to assume something Roman would crop up in the area. However the size and scale of what was unearthed was the real surprise.

Just over 20 years ago, a sharp-eyed digger driver needing to clear a new driveway, saw cube-shaped stones of various colours coming up in the space being cleared. The property owner realised they were something of note and contacted the County Archaeologist. His experience told him that they were likely to have been used for a mosaic pavement floor.

The story that unravelled over the next few weeks and the subsequent years have had a dramatic effect on our understanding of this landscape and village.



Further investigation made it apparent that this was a large and almost complete mosaic and was of major importance and subsequently of national significance. However it was autumn, and if left unprotected from the winter weather it would have broken up and been lost for ever.

In the following month using non-invasive archaeological techniques what was discovered was carefully cleaned, recorded and protected.



It was then expertly covered and buried again to make sure it was not damaged but remained in its original position where it had been for almost 2000 years.

The find generated an extraordinary level of the publicity. Nation wide news gave bulletins and even announced weather forecasts over Lopen. It extended internationally, including a feature in Time Magazine in the USA.

Then all went silent, as there was nothing left to show for the four short weeks of activity. However it was important to make sure it was not to be forgotten. A panel was reconstructed from the foot worn tesserae, and was placed in the only permanently accessible covered space in the village - the Church, and is all that is left to see of what lies beneath part of our little village.

This enables us to continue to touch the lives of the Romano-British inhabitants of Lopen of 2000 years ago.

BUT - it was all filmed, and a newly edited release of the story and the Lopen Mosaic is scheduled for the weekend of July 8/9th 2023.

We will show the film in the Sunday School and Church and will be displaying a variety of objects associated with the excavation and some aspects of Romano British life.
