

Our Parish Council Reports Back

Basic Life Support Training

(Sarah Mason writes:)

As you are all aware we have recently purchased an external automated defibrillator (AED) which can be used in the event of a cardiac arrest happening within our community. A cardiac arrest happens when a person's heart fails to efficiently pump blood around the body, due either to the inability to contract effectively or to a disruption in the electrical pathway. This is an emergency situation, and your actions can save that person's life if you administer CPR and defibrillation in a timely manner. Recent figures show that approximately 28,000 out-of-hospital cardiac arrests happen each year; 80% within the home, and 20% in public places. Currently survival to discharge from hospital equates to 8.6%. This figure would almost certainly increase if more people carried out bystander CPR. At present only 43% of patients who suffer an out-of-hospital cardiac arrest receive bystander CPR. For every minute without CPR and defibrillation, the chance of survival is reduced by 7-10%.

Free Training Offered In Lopen

As a result of this we would like to offer BLS (basic life support) sessions to as many members of our community as possible. These sessions will cover recognition of the collapsed/sick patient, CPR, and defibrillation. I am anticipating that the sessions will last approximately one and a half hours, and would like them to be interactive.

We are planning two sessions in March. The first on the 20th which will be by invitation only for members of the PC and groups that regularly use the Schoolroom. The second on the 27th that will be the first of the wider public sessions (Lopen residents only please). Subject to demand, additional sessions will held during April and the dates will be announced in the next Lopen Eye. All sessions will start at 7pm in the Schoolroom, Church Street, Lopen with limited numbers (small groups) at each session.



If you wish to apply to attend a session, the preferred contact is by email to the PC Clerk- Kim McDonald. If email is not possible for you, then call and leave a message on her answer phone (see back page).

Please indicate you wish to attend a session and provide your full name, Lopen street name and email address and/or telephone contact number. Please do not be disappointed if you do not get selected for the first session (which will be on a first come first served basis), you will go an a list to attend a later session (subject to availability).

Lopenhead Industrial Site

(Teresa Sienkiewicz writes:)

It was reported in November's Eye that SSDC's Area North Committee had again given planning permission for a huge new building at Lopen Head. This follows a judge previously quashing the original permission. He found that the rationale that SSDC had used in granting permission personal to Probiotics was unenforceable and irrational.

The matter has again been referred to the High Court, and the go-ahead has been given, on a number of grounds, to take the matter to judicial review for a second time. It is anticipated that the case will be heard in late spring or early summer. The Parish Council is also looking into concerns that planning conditions are not being met (most notably the landscaping) relating to the existing site.
