WE HAVE A WORLD CHAMPION! Congratulations to Guy Anderson - he is a World Champion!



The 2020 World XContest has just ended and Guy has been declared the winner in the OPEN category. All three winners had their longest flights from Brazil towing sites (Caico & Assu).



First place, for the first time, is British pilot Guy Anderson with his longest flight of 535km and a total score of 2778 points. Second place goes to Swiss Sebastian Benz, with a seasonal maximum of 553km and a total of 2730 points. And third place, with 2583 points, is Juan Sebastian Ospina also from the United Kingdom.

NEW GATEWAYS FOR LOPEN

These are all part of the long awaited County Highways Small Improvement Scheme (SIS) for Lopen to improve road safety.

THE STOCKS HAVE RETURNED TO LOPEN!



John Milner has recently changed the name of his cottage to Stocks Cottage, in recognition of the stocks that used to be situated at Cross Tree in Lopen. They are to replace the original village Stocks, in which a young Curate Wolsey (later to be Cardinal Wolsey) was placed for being drunk & disorderly at the Lopen Fair in the early 1500's. He was put in the stocks by Sir Amyas Paulet (or Poulett), who was Sheriff at the time. Wolsey never forgave Poulett and as Lord Chancellor, Wolsey ordered Poulett to court and kept him waiting in daily attendance for five years – he was threatened with having all of his property confiscated if he failed to attend.

The new stocks are fully useable - so no misbehaving in Lopen! They could also be useful for people caught speeding through the village!





We will be running a simple version of the Coffee Stop.
