RAINFALL UPDATE

Jeremy Rook has kindly supplied the following data: This was only my second wettest May - I recorded 157mm in May 2002.

April was drier in 2007 when we only received 4mm in total and we also had 8mm in 2011. I have a rainfall buddy in Haselbury Plucknett who consistently receives 8 - 10 % more rain than us here - we are closer to the barren desert heart of Somerset which lies between Bridgwater and Somerton!

After only 7.7mm in April I recorded a total of 147.9mm for May. The wettest period was 12th/ 13th May when I recorded 45.5mm in 24 hours.

30 years ago this month John Milner closed his workshop in Church Street and flew to Marathon just outside Athens and ran home - a distance of 2600 miles! He did it to raise money for Marie Curie Cancer Care. As it amounted to 100 marathons, he called it the Hekathon from the Greek ekato for 100.

Carrying his own kit including a bivvy bag, he averaged 34 miles per day and slept where he could. As well as Greece, the route took in the former Yugoslavia just before the Balkan wars, Italy, Switzerland and France. He had hoped to run through the newly constructed channel tunnel but despite initial permission, it was finally declined for safety reasons. The trees on the North side of our churchyard were donated by an American family to commemorate the run.
