Flubot - Text Message Scam.

We have been made aware of a new text message scam called Flubot. This is a malicious piece of Spyware that is installed on your Android device

(mobile phone or tablet), once you receive a text message asking you to install a Tracking App due to a 'missed package delivery'. The 'Tracking App' will actually steal your passwords and other sensitive data, whilst sending messages to your contacts to do the same.

The text message asks the user to click on a link - **PLEASE DON'T**, doing so will take you to a website where you will be prompted to download the App - **DEFINITELY DON'T!**

Please forward any scam messages to 7726 (SPAM on your keypad), which is a free reporting service. Although this scam only appears on Android phones at the moment, Apple iOS users should remain alert as this could apply to these devices at some point. As you may be aware from the Lopen Eye, our Spring Plant Fair was this year an 'open nursery' held at 'The Bakehouse' where a mouth-watering display of plants was laid out under marquees.

The result was an amazing £1,401

OUR CHURCHYARD

Last year Lopen Church PCC (Parochial Church Council) nurtured a small meadow area in the churchyard to encourage plant species and wildlife. This year, the churches of Lopen, Merriott, Hinton St George and Dinnington have been awarded a Co-op Community Fund grant to further develop 'eco initiatives' in their churchyards. So we are building on the success of last year.



We have formed a small steering group (Ben Goldsmith, Nick Jones, Philip Harper and Mary Chapman) to take the project forward in Lopen, and have registered the church with the Somerset Wildlife Trust's 'Wilder Churches' scheme and the national 'Eco Church' movement.

By their nature, churches and churchyards are good places for plants and wildlife. The combination of old walls, monuments and buildings, hedges and mature trees provide a wealth of habitats for lichens, invertebrates, and birds. Our aim is to identify and encourage these, whilst maintaining the churchyard as a haven of calm for remembrance and a pleasant place for everyone to visit.

So far, we have started to make lists of species found, with a simple record sheet for people to jot down details of what they've noticed, put up some beautiful oak bird nest boxes (thank you Seamus and Nick), enhanced the meadow area with plug plants and hazel hoops to mark its boundaries. We are considering holding an Open Day to involve people in identifying and recording what species are in place. Would you be able to help with this? We would welcome your ideas and comments (if possible by mid June please) on what elements of Lopen Churchyard you particularly value and how you would like to develop biodiversity of this beautiful area.
