ANOTHER NEW COUNCILLOR

At our June meeting we were fortunate enough to be able to co-opt Simon Frackiewicz as a new



councillor. A village resident for two years with a young family, Simon is keen to get more involved in village life. He is particularly interested in the road safety improvement scheme, though this is by no means his only interest and he brings a number of

useful ideas with him. He also brings his years of experience as a business owner, people manager, fundraiser and negotiator to the council and I believe we are very lucky to have him.

NEW COUNCILLORS

The Council has one further vacancy so there is still the opportunity to join if you wish to put yourself forward.

ANNUAL FINANCIAL RETURN

At the June meeting the internally audited annual financial return was approved by the Council. It has now been submitted to Grant Thornton for external audit and draft copies can be found on the Council notice board and village website.

ROAD SAFETY IMPROVEMENTS

We have now finally had the written follow up to our meeting with County Highways. While we have moved on considerably from their original proposal, there is still room for improvement. The Council is working with SLOW to make a response to this and continue to press for a reduced speed limit before County Highways submit their next formal design proposal.

BROADBAND

As you have probably gathered from earlier editions of the Eye, the arrival of the new BT cabinet in Holloway has made Superfast Broadband available to much of the village. Some residents are already enjoying connection speeds of up to 75Mbps. So, if you are wanting a faster connection, it is well worth checking again at:

In most cases you should find that you are now connected to Cabinet 17, meaning a Superfast service is possible. A few may find they are still connected to Cabinet 11, which unfortunately means that Superfast is not yet available to them. We are also aware of at least one case where a property is listed as connected to Cabinet 17, but is in fact still connected to Cabinet 4. This meant that their upgrade failed, causing all kinds of complications. Our understanding is that all households formerly connected to Cabinet 4 should have been moved to Cabinet 17, so if you find yourself still listed as being connected to Cabinet 4 or are having problems with an upgrade as described above, please contact Nick Jones or Roger Gurner, so it can be taken up with CDS.

One further word on this: when approaching your provider for an upgrade, you will probably find they want to charge you more for the privilege. They may also be offering better deals for new customers than existing customers, something wholly unacceptable in my view. Do a bit of homework first and haggle with them. It's a competitive market and they will do a deal!

FOOTPATHS

Following the success of the footpaths clearance event in May and with wet and then warm weather causing vigorous weed growth, it has been decided to have a second event on Saturday 5th August at the same time as the annual churchyard tidying day. It is hoped that combining the two will bring in a wider cross-section of the village.

people as they can carry Lyme's disease, so pet owners should check their animals carefully and children and adults should wear long trousers when walking through grassland. If you or your pet gets a tick do not pull it out or you will just pull off the body leaving the head in the flesh. Get professional help.

This month's update on the state of play with Lopen CSW. Of the more than 6,500 vehicles observed to date 357 have been reported and of those 158 (or over 44%) have

been travelling at 40 MPH or faster within the 30mph speed limits.

What is perhaps of interest is that, with the lighter evenings, we have operated several sessions later in the day - that is after the normal working day - and have found the proportion of vehicles exceeding the speed limits tends to increase. This has also been our experience with sessions held at weekends.
