ROADSIDE 'SID' FOR LOPEN



As you may be aware the question of the continuing provision of SIDs in the village has been the subject of much discussion over recent months. The choice finally coming down to accepting a reduced scheme from

Somerset County Council using mostly old equipment at a cost of £100 per session, with perhaps 4 to 6 two week sessions per year, or providing our own device that could possibly be in use for at least 40 weeks of the year at an initial cost of between £2,500 and £3,500, dependent on the type of device purchased. There would be a further cost of at least £600 for the cost of essential training by SCC approved providers. with currently up to £150 being covered by the County. These options have been the subject, both within and outside, of recent LPC meetings. At the Annual Parish meeting on the 12th May broad agreement was reached that the village might go ahead with a self funded solution. The final details of the legal positions of both the LPC in such a scheme and any monies raised will be decided in the near future. At the Annual meeting Roger Gurner, as Co-Chair of SLOW, volunteered to be responsible for raising the money from the village for the purchase of a device, and he has been very encouraged by initial indications of support, with the LPC undertaking to meet the cost of any training required and assuming legal ownership in order to ensure insurance cover for both the equipment and public liability

to request pledges, at this stage, for any sum that you might be prepared to offer, rather than become involved in collecting any actual funds, until the position of the LPC is completely clear.

Roger is therefore asking that should you feel able to make a contribution of any amount you could indicate to him, in complete confidence, the sum you might have in mind. Any figure from £1.00 to £1,000 will help, and would be very gratefully received, to achieve the target to help reduce the speed of traffic through our village and personal safety of anyone using, or crossing, the roads in Lopen. Once the legal positions are satisfactorily established, he will approach all who have offered 'pledges' to ask that they make their donations directly to the LPC, who will act as fund holder to ensure complete financial transparency. Thanks to you all for your generosity and concern for the safety of life in our village.

VILLAGE MEETING

Saturday 12th May was a very busy day. In the morning the spring plant sale brought many people from the village and further afield to the Church and Sunday School room. Helped by excellent organisation and fine weather, this turned out to be extraordinarily successful with good trade done in both plants and refreshments! It also provided plenty of opportunity to chat and get people's views on local matters. I was also delighted to see people posting their completed surveys, with a number taking a second sheet after failing to come to a household agreement!

Then, in the evening the "official" part of the village meeting took place, though with plenty of cheese and wine on hand to dispel any sense of formality. This was an enjoyable and very useful evening with plenty of lively discussion. Though many matters were discussed, the one that is clearly at the forefront of people minds is that of the main road, traffic speed and the need for a speed indication device. While the Council has been looking at this for a while, there was a clear message that the process needs to be speeded up, and if cost is a problem, there are ways around it.

SPEED INDICATION DEVICE (SID)

Further to the feelings expressed at the village meeting, a SID working party was formed at the May PC meeting - comprising Stephen Crane, Roger Gurner, Nick Jones and Jenny Feeney. As we now know that no neighbouring parishes are

interested in a shared scheme, the immediate emphasis is on getting an accurate idea of costs and thus how much will need to be raised from private donation, business donation and grants to supplement available Council funds.

VILLAGE SURVEY

After the hard work put in by Simon Frackiewicz and his family in the production and distribution of the village questionnaire, I'm very pleased to say that, at time of writing, well over 30 have been returned - a great result. As the closing date was the end of May the results are not yet in, but Simon will be working to collate them as soon as possible. Your supportive comments have been much appreciated!
