

#### **Parish Ranger**

Lopen will have a ranger working in the village every 3rd Tuesday in the month maintaining the high standards we have grown to accept. If you feel something needs to be done, please let me (01460 240458), or the Chairman know and we will try to sort the problem out with the Ranger.

## **Update on lorry problem**

Sarah's photo taken this month shows a typical instance of lorries on Holloway. We have contacted Ceara Sturt, our local community support officer, and it appears that unless traffic police follow a vehicle through the village, there is no realistic chance of prosecution. However, if we report persistent offenders, it may be possible for the police to take up the matter with the culprits. We have invited Ceara to attend a Parish Council meeting to discuss the issues with the community and in particular those who live on or near the Holloway who are so badly affected.

We are considering a community initiative, whereby volunteers man areas at the start and finish of the restriction to take details of vehicles breaching the weight limits. If we capture offenders on camera, we can report on the scale of the problem and provide proof to support our attempts for constructive intervention. There is a model letter on the village website which you as individuals can use to report transgressions to Ceara. If you are interested, please contact Stephen, who is the PC member for highways, or Teresa, who has volunteered to help with this initiative.

#### **Dog Fouling**

#### **Parish Bulb Planting Scheme**

Lopen, along with other parishes, will be provided with 2000 mixed bulb for planting in public areas in and around the village as part of SSDC's district wide planting scheme. For 2015 these bulbs will be a random mix of Grape Hyacinth, Loddon Lily, Snowdrops, Snakes Head Fritillary, English Bluebells and Star of Bethlehem - no daffodils this time around. Your ideas for where planting should happen would be most welcomed and please contact me if you are able to volunteer for some planting. Bulbs will be delivered in mid-October.



#### **DOORSTEP CALLERS**

Be suspicious of any offers to do gardening, roofing, guttering, drainage, driveway or electrical work from anybody who turns up uninvited at your door. Don't invite unexpected callers in to your home and never pay any cash up-front. Always obtain a receipt.

If you are suspicious about a doorstep trader or feel threatened in any way, report it to the Police as soon as possible (ideally while they're still in the area). Telephone 101 for all non-urgent reports and enquiries or 999 in an emergency. Also consider displaying a door sticker to say 'we do not buy or sell to callers at the door.' (available through the NHW office at 25p each).
