### So where do we go for our picnic and dancing.....


Our Village Picnic will be held in the field above Rosehue Cottage - courtesy of Michael & Valerie Canton.

#### COMPUTER CLINIC




The next Clinic will be at the June Coffee Stop:

#### **ECO UPDATE**

## Birdsong in Lopen Churchyard - (Take two cows, David!)

Having planted almost 150 wildflower plug plants in our meadow area, the dry end to April and early May made watering necessary for the eco-group. However this task was made easier by the birdsong

heard. The first was the Great Tit with it's call of 'teacher, teacher teacher'. Later the beautiful song of the blackbird (for those of a certain age the first five notes of 'Barbie Girl' may be noticed!) Another two note call is that of the Chiff Chaff. This is a summer visitor which says it's name over and over again. I listened for a Song Thrush but did not hear one. The call



is a repeated phrase of notes, usually three times each group different to the last. Hardly melodious but nevertheless interesting is the cackling call of the Magpie. If two 'converse' it sounds like two old gentlemen telling after dinner jokes, Again not really a song but the call of the Wood-Pigeon is also interesting for the folklore associated with it. It has several variations but the one often heard at this time of the year is of five notes. The RSPB suggest that in some parts of the country children thought they said 'Take two cows, David'. After extensive research several years ago (I asked my mother) she told me that in Crewkerne in the 1930's they said the call was 'My toe hurts, Betty'. A friend of hers who grew up in South Wales used to say 'Take two cows, Taffy' In our house we have told the older grandchildren that they say 'It's your round, Tommy' - but that's another story.

#### No Mow May

My lawn might look terrible in May, but it is buzzing with life. All those daisies, buttercups and dandelions that have been allowed to push their heads up during my 'no mow May' have attracted and fed a diverse array of bees, beetles and birds, not to mention resting my mower..... And so it is with the small area of uncut grass in Lopen

Churchyard. Left unmown during spring and summer, even this small area of old turf yields a remarkable opportunity to support wildlife. Unlike the surrounding agricultural landscape, our churchyard has received few pesticides and fertilizers, and as a result, when left unmown has sprung back to life with many of the old meadow plants that have otherwise declined over the past decades. As we reflect on the Queen's Platinum Jubilee, perhaps we should also consider that during her extraordinary reign we have lost over 90% of our wildflower meadows and seen a reduction of over 50% of our common songbirds. Wildlife should not be allowed to become a luxury item, it should be the norm. No mow May, and

small areas of sensitively managed grassland, such as those in our churchyards, can have a remarkable and positive impact for the wildlife in our villages and wider countryside. What might seem like small individual actions in our gardens and communities can in fact help swing the tide of biodiversity loss in the UK and bring nature and all its benefits back to be commonplace.

#### Did you know....?

What we consider to be the humble "dandelion" actually consist of 240 separate species within the UK – all so similar, it has taken decades of research to identify and separate them.

There are over 270 species of bee in the UK – and honey bees and bumblebees account for only about 10% of these. The rest are mainly solitary, and do not sting!
