Following his accident at Beer Head in July, John Milner ran a hugely successful fund raising event at Cross Tree House on Saturday 12th March. The idea was to bake and sell as many scones as possible within a 10 hour period. The weather was fair and an attendance of over 500 people enjoyed a lovely day, being entertained by the Dr. Turbeville's Morris Dancers, the Langport Mummers performing "King Alfred burns the scones", Jonathan Weeks playing medieval instruments, James Crowden's poetry and music from 'Bad Dog no Biscuit'. At the end of the day 1143 scones had been baked and an incredible £6856 had been raised for the Dorset and Somerset Air Ambulance and the Devon Air Ambulance who assisted him after the accident. The event was covered by BBC Points West, BBC Somerset and Abbey 104 FM as well as the Times, Mail on-line, Mirror on-line, Metro, Western Daily Press, Western Gazette, etc. but had some stiff opposition from the Rugby! John would like to thank all those people who freely gave their time, equipment, facilities and labour to make the day a success. PLANNING

We seem to be beset by planning issues at present. FROGMARY GREEN FARM - work continues apace on the anaerobic digester and it appears that a new gasholder is being built despite the fact that the site developer, Greener for Life, has not been granted planning permission for that and other structures on the site, such as the surface LPG storage tanks. To date, no enforcement action has been taken, nor has any planning decision been made, as much information relevant to the application has not yet been submitted. The tactic of applying for permission, and then building something else and subsequently applying for retrospective permission when residents have complained, has been adopted by Greener for Life at a number of sites in Devon and Cornwall. The retrospective application for the site at Menchine Farm in Mid-Devon was turned down by the local District Council and its refusal has now been backed up by the Planning Inspector charged with hearing the appeal, who turned it down on 18th March.

At the 'business parks' (where the landscaping requirements have been neither implemented nor enforced), we have identified more planning breaches:

MILL LANE - a local resident noticed that a substantial new building was going up without permission and as a result of our report, SSDC have imposed a temporary stop notice. We have also spotted advertisements for a new carpet showroom despite the fact that retail use is not permitted there. This has also been reported to SSDC who have acknowledged our notification. LOPEN HEAD - Meanwhile at Lopen Head, there is an advertisement for 'Champagne Cave' on the Lift West site. The SSDC licensing department has informed us that there is no licence and confirmed that both the licensing and planning rules have been breached.

TRAFFIC CALMING MEASURES

The complaints about the size of tractors and lorries speeding through the village, (some without visible or with obscured number plates), and causing havoc are flooding in at present, with people being woken as early as 4.30 am by the noise and vibration. We would be very grateful if all residents who spot vehicles breaching the speed and the 7.5 tonne limit report the offenders to the police. We are pleased that Ben Goldsmith's complaint about one particular company has resulted in the police contacting the culprits and making it clear to them that driving their lorries through the village is an offence. Now that the weather is better, we are hoping that we can set up a more regular watch system to ensure that we alert the authorities to the problem and get some

enforcement. We can make a difference! Christopher Le Hardy, our County Councillor, notified the parish council at its 15th March meeting that he had obtained some monies from the County Council for traffic calming measures. There were surveys under the chairmanship of Peter Little and Barry Davolls as to what residents would like, so we shall be putting the options which came out of them to you shortly.

DUALLING OF THE A303

Roger and Teresa attended Highways England's presentation on the proposals, not that Teresa heard much because, yet again, no induction loop was provided. We were advised that the first phase involved Salisbury Plain, the Sparkford-Podimore stretch and the dualling of the A385 that links the A303 to the M5. Our County Councillor has told us that plans are being considered to widen the Ilminster by-pass, but we are not clear yet on what this might entail.

EGWOOD

The acquisition of Egwood was discussed at length at the March PC meeting. Barry continues to investigate the alternatives for the required insurances.

UPDATE ON LOPEN WAR MEMORIAL.....

As you may know a local historian (Peter Forrester) has been making a survey of all the War Memorials

in Somerset and he identified four men born in Lopen who were killed during the First World War, but were not listed on Lopen's memorial. However one was listed on Merriott's memorial, and one was listed on South Petherton's. This left two brothers who have not been listed on any local memorial at all. As a joint initiative, both Lopen Parish Council and Lopen P.C.C. have undertaken to rectify this. To that



end work will be started in the better weather to add their names to the memorial.

It was felt that just like the erection of the memorial in 1920 it was only correct that cost should be opened up to voluntary public subscription, with the cost being underwritten by both councils.

COUNTRYSIDE CODE FOR THE PUBLIC

Spring is a lovely time of year when we 'break out' from the winter and enjoy the countryside. Daffodils, lambs, and the lovely fresh air. So, just a reminder to think of the farmers too when out walking. Remember:

- Leave gates and property as you find them and follow paths.
- A farmer will normally close gates to keep farm animals in, but may sometimes leave them open so the animals can reach food and water.
- Leave gates as you find them or follow instructions on signs. When in a group, make sure the last person knows how to leave the gates.
- Follow paths unless wider access is available, such as on open country or registered common land (known as 'Open Access' land).
